Survey Results:

Results were varied but with the main emphasis on infrastructure in our area.

Upgrade the bike paths

Completing the Bike Path along Broken Head Road was the single most wanted item with traffic management at Clifford Street and pothole repairs a close second.

Sports field makeover

Makeover of the sports field with shade and benches is a high priority for the community.

Who uses the sports field precinct:

Byron Bay Cricket Club, Suffolk Park Phoenix Football Club, young skaters daily. The two tennis Courts are used everyday, and young children with their parents/carers use the playground.

Some of the proposed improvements to the sports field are;

- An amenities block with change room facilities.
- Basic canteen attached to amenities block.
- A larger and more interesting child play area.
- Upgrade of the skate ramp.
- Installation of a secure netting barrier at the southern end of the football field.
- Lighting for night training and security around the tennis courts, skate park and amenities block.

Community Garden

At the Council meeting on 22nd March, Council resolved to support the establishment of a Suffolk Park Community Garden. The location of the garden is proposed for Dengah Place (if viable) or Beech Drive if not.
